As we celebrate our annual Bishop's Dinner we focus on the central mission of the Church as well as the central mission of each and every disciple of Jesus Christ: to proclaim the Good News – that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, has come into the world and has saved and delivered us from darkness. We must always keep our focus on this primary mission.

The desire for Jesus Christ is alive and thriving in the parishes of our Diocese and throughout our community. I express my deepest gratitude to the priests of the Diocese who work tirelessly in the vineyard to bring Jesus to His people. I am continuously encouraged with the various ministries offered throughout our parishes and ECRC, which help others to grow in a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. I am also profoundly grateful to you, faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, who through your generous contributions – both spiritual and financial – have helped the Church to strengthen Her mission in proclaiming the Good News to all.

Each month, approximately 9 to 13% of parish collections are sent to the Diocese. Together, with nearly \$750,000 raised at last year's Bishop's Dinner, these funds help support our seminarians, clergy, parishes, chancery office, and vital diocesan projects, both current and future.

The hunger for Jesus Christ, like the growth of our community, continues to expand, and the Diocese must grow as well to ensure our people are nourished by the Word of God. As we look towards the exciting future of the growth of our Diocese we look forward to a number of projects that seek to better serve you, the Church: the ongoing renovations at Mar Eliya Retreat Center, set to open this coming spring; the desire of a start of a Chaldean Catholic school system; and the hopeful founding of three more parishes in the near future, with one in Commerce Township area, one in the Macomb Township area, and another in the Bloomfield Hills area.

As the needs of the Church grow, I am confident that God will continue to provide. This summer, we can expect the ordination of two men to the priesthood, Deacons Eahab Ishak and Joseph Nannoshi, and another two to the diaconate. Where there is a need, God truly supplies!

My friends, the world today is searching for the Good News, searching for Jesus Christ. We have found Him and now we seek to build our community and our families upon Him, this foundation of Rock that will last for generations to come. Let us ensure that future generations of Chaldeans will continue to hold onto the faith.

With this mission in mind, and our commitment to financial transparency, I invite you to review the 2024 Annual Report for the Chaldean Catholic Diocese of St. Thomas the Apostle of the United States, which can be found in this program.

Let us continue to pray for our Church, our Diocese, our clergy, that we may forever work to proclaim the name of Jesus Christ, both now and forever.

OUR DIOCESE

The Chaldean Diocese of St. Thomas the Apostle is an Eastern Rite diocese (eparchy) under the Chaldean Catholic Patriarchate of Babylon in Baghdad, Iraq.

Once covering the entire United States, the diocese now serves about 200,000 U.S. Catholics in the eastern half of the country. Metro Detroit has the highest concentration of Chaldeans in the United States, and ten of the diocese's twelve parishes are in Michigan, with the other two parishes in Illinois.








2025 Oridinations
