My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our Diocese continues to grow and burn with zeal for the mission of the Church: to proclaim the Gospel, and to make Jesus Christ known in all corners of the world. Focusing on this mission, we first begin with our Chaldean Catholic community here in the Eastern United States. As we continue to expand and grow, we must keep our focus on our primary mission.

I would like to begin by expressing my gratitude to all of the parishes, our clergy who bring Jesus to you, and to each one of you: the faithful disciples of Christ, who continue to support the Church and Her mission. Your contributions, both spiritually and financially, help the Church to spread the Gospel message of Jesus Christ, and to maintain and nourish that which has already been established.

Approximately 9% to 13% of monthly parish collections are sent to the Diocese each month. This, along with nearly \$600,000 raised at last year's annual Bishop's Dinner, helps to support our seminarians, clergy, parishes, chancery office, and current and future Diocesan projects.

In the past few years, we have seen many projects that have been initiated by the Diocese and need our continued support such as the renovations of Mar Eliya Retreat Center in Oxford; the purchase of over a hundred acres for the purpose of founding our newest parish, Holy Spirit Chaldean Catholic Church in Commerce; the ongoing renovations and construction at Our Lady of the Fields Camp; and the founding of our first Chaldean Catholic preschool in the Diocese. As the community continues to grow in metro-Detroit the Diocese is also actively searching for a property to build a parish for those who reside in and around Macomb Township.

As we are blessed with so many parishes in the Diocese we are also blessed with so many vocations to the priesthood. This past year we have witnessed the ordination of Father Namir Narra, our newest priest, and in the coming years, we will – God-willing – expect a few more.

My friends, the world today needs Jesus Christ; our families need Jesus Christ; we need Jesus Christ. The world hungers for Him and thirsts for Him. The more we build up His Church, the more people can witness the Good News.

With this pivotal mission in mind, kindly find in this program the 2023 Annual Report for the Chaldean Catholic Diocese of St. Thomas the Apostle of the United States. I am extremely grateful for your ongoing generous support of the Diocese and its work. The Chaldean Church in the Eastern United States could not have been this successful without your continued support.

Let us continue to pray for our Diocese, our clergy, and our Church – that we may forever proclaim the name of Jesus, both now and forever.

The Chaldean Diocese of St. Thomas the Apostle is an Eastern Rite diocese (eparchy) under the Chaldean Catholic Patriarchate of Babylon in Baghdad, Iraq.

Once covering the entire United States, the diocese now serves about 180,000 U.S. Catholics in the eastern half of the country. Metro Detroit has the highest concentration of Chaldeans in the United States, and ten of the diocese's twelve parishes are in Michigan.

Bay Pointe Commerce Twp Property (Holy Spirit Chaldean Catholic Church)

The ultimate goal of the purchase of the hundred acres of land in Commerce Township is to establish a new Chaldean Catholic Church and parish site. Building costs are at an all-time high and traffic studies need to be done in order to make the most prudent and best decision for this property. In the meantime, the Diocese will outsource the operations of the golf course and banquet facility so that loan payments are covered by the revenue. As more information and decisions are made, the Diocese will continue to be transparent.





Active Search for Macomb County Church

As our community continues to grow and thrive in the metro Detroit area, we are aware of the need for more churches to accommodate the sacramental and spiritual needs of our people, especially further north east in Macomb County. The Diocese is actively looking for either a church building to convert to a Chaldean Catholic Church or a large enough land to build a new church and parish site. The map shows the area where we are actively looking. It is a process that requires patience and diligence. We are confident that God will provide the right location that will serve our community.

Our Lady of the Fields Camp

Our Lady of the Fields Camp and Retreat Center, located in Brighton, Michigan, has undergone some major changes this past year. A place where family, fun, and faith all run parallel. Our Lady of the Fields has been providing kids and families with endless opportunities to enjoy their summer at camp since 2010. Due to our community's ongoing generosity and support, the camp has taken strides in renovating and updating the grounds. Some of those changes include a newly renovated kitchen, new floors in the dining area, updated cabins and bathrooms, new lake inflatables, and even a newly restored pontoon. We couldn't have made these renovations without our community's help and support and we hope to see the camp continue to flourish this year! Our Lady of the Fields has entered into an exciting partnership with Damascus from the Diocese of Columbus, OH to offer their premier Catholic youth summer camp program. Camp Damascus is an exciting and vibrant Catholic summer camp that hosts 8 different weeks where teens from middle school and high school can detach from worldly comforts and experience Jesus and authentic Catholic fellowship all while having a fun summer camp experience.











Mar Eliya Retreat Center

The many retreats that are hosted through our parishes and ECRC have been very fruitful for thousands of Chaldeans who have attended them throughout the years. We are blessed to have the Boji family donate the funds for the purchase of this retreat center and over 40 acres of land that go with it. The process of renovations, however, will take time as we make sure that the facility will accommodate our needs for many decades. Again, this takes time and patience. A few architectural renditions have been commissioned and due to the state of the current building, it will take well over \$3-\$4 million to renovate. Finances are always challenging in the church, thus, we must approach this renovation task diligently, prudently, and intentionally.

Saint Thomas Montessori School

Ever since opening its doors in January of 2023, St. Thomas Montessori Preschool has experienced nothing but growth and success through the staff, children, and parents. We were blessed to have 80+ children enrolled this year. The school's commitment to fostering a fruitful and faithful environment for the children has been instrumental in its growth. Furthermore, the school's emphasis on instilling the faith and prayers of Jesus Christ in the children has been very fruitful this past year. Due to its ongoing success, there is currently a waitlist of families who are eager to enroll their children. As it continues to evolve and thrive, the school remains steadfast in its mission to nurture young minds both educationally and spiritually.
